

OUR BLESSED PAST

For 115 years, St. John the Evangelist Catholic Parish has been an institution in Loveland. Our story began in 1901 when a building at 5th and Grant in downtown opened its doors to Catholics in the community. Two years later, a Romanesque-style church opened and was named in honor of the Apostle and Evangelist, Saint John.

After several decades of steady growth, the parish acquired land in the northwest region of Loveland in 1951. On May 1, 1957, the parish's long-awaited Catholic school was officially dedicated. The school gymnasium began serving as the temporary worship space for the rapidly growing parish. By the late 1960's, Saint John's had already swelled from 500 families to 850.

Over the next several years, Saint John's went through a series of significant changes. In 1969, our current church building was constructed to accommodate the new parish members. Since then, Saint John's parishioners have joined together several more times to meet the increasing demand; they expanded the foyer, remodeled Saint John's Hall, constructed a much-needed middle school and a chapel for Perpetual Adoration.

Today, our parish continues to fulfill the vision of Catholic faith, a legacy we inherited from the last 100 years.

As the only Catholic parish in Loveland, Saint John's provides a spiritual center in our community. It is a place where our faith community gathers to worship God in Holy Mass, to baptize newborns, celebrate our children's First Communion, where couples begin a new life in Holy Matrimony and where we become the hands and means of God as we reach out in our ministries.

Today, Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church is a parish of more than 1,800 families in a geographic region growing at a rate of almost 10 percent per year. The pioneers who set Saint John in motion over a century ago had a vision to pass the faith on to future generations, and they succeeded in achieving their goal. Now, we have the great privilege to continue this legacy for our children, grandchildren and future generations who will come to Loveland.

PLANS for a faithful FUTURE

For the last several years, parish leadership have put together a plan for our church that will allow our legacy of faith to thrive. This has included a parishwide survey, the creation of several architecture renderings, and our recent planning study. Through this process of inquiry and analysis, parish leaders have worked with architects to develop the following recommended improvements.

OUR GOALS Church and Narth

Fellowship Hall

Church and Narthex (Foyer) Interior Renovation | \$2,187,000

Our community built the current church in 1969 to accommodate our growing parish. We have not made considerable interior updates since that time. Renovations will include development of a center aisle, aesthetic design improvements in the nave of the church, a new baptistry, centering the tabernacle and expanding the gathering space at the immediate entrance to the nave of the church. We'll upgrade lighting and acoustics and add a new altar, ambo and confessional. A new open glass wall will provide visibility between the narthex and nave for a more welcoming experience.


New Fellowship Hall | \$3,240,000

To help inspire and deepen fellowship, a modern parish hall will significantly increase our parish's capacity to gather as a community of faith. The new parish hall will have an expanded commercial kitchen for events, provide space for special gatherings and invite parishioners to congregate after Mass. To accommodate an aging demographic, having this hall accessible on the same level as the church meets the needs of this population.

New Parish Office Building and Demolition of Existing Office | \$2,055,375

FELLOWSHIP

The current parish offices are in a house on Hilltop Drive, hidden behind the church building. The house is old and does not meet modern building codes for office safety. Moreover, it is hard to find for parishioners and potential new parishioners. A new, two-story office building will be constructed on the northwest corner of the church to accommodate all ministry offices.

PLEDGES

Pledges are commitments made in good faith, but are not legally binding. We ask that you consider making a pledge over a three-year period to maximize the total amount of your support. This commitment can be fulfilled through monthly, quarterly, semiannual or annual installments. If you choose to give online, this can be set up via FaithDirect, our online giving platform.

CASH

Gifts of cash are the most common and will allow the parish to address its immediate needs. Donating cash is as simple as using cash or writing a check and placing it in the collection or bringing it by the parish office. You can also do this by authorizing a withdrawal via FaithDirect.

GIFTS OF SECURITIES

Stocks, bonds or mutual funds that have been held for at least one year and have appreciated offer special tax advantages. You will receive a tax deduction for the full market value of the gift but you will not have to pay capital gains tax on the appreciated amount. If you sell depreciated stock and contribute the proceeds, you will receive both a tax deduction for the charitable gift and a deduction for the capital loss.

PLANNED GIFTS

Planned giving is the process of carefully selecting the best method and asset for making a charitable gift. Such a gift can enable you to take full advantage of the tax laws to accomplish your financial and charitable goals. Below are a few commonly used ways to making a planned gift:

- Bequest by will or living trust
- Charitable Remainder Trusts
- Charitable Gift Annuities
- Charitable Lead Trusts
- Beneficiary benefits from IRAs, pensions or financial accounts.

You are advised to consult your own qualified professional advisor to determine which method of giving is most beneficial for you.


